Autocross has its first event, with the SCCA on April 15th. I would like approval of the following two initiatives to assist in reducing the communication project deficit:

- 1. The Dashboard advertising rate should be reduced for P4US advertisers in good standing. This represents a discount on the current rates. We only have 2 advertisers. I believe I can generate cross selling sales to existing magazine advertisers once they come to realize the power of the dashboard.
- 2. I want approval to offer a one time teaser rate to non-P4US advertisers to purchase an ad in the dashboard. Hopefully I can generate interest in advertising with NNJR and transit them from the Dashboard to P4US as additional revenue.

Membership: [Marlys Thovson]

[March] NNJR ended the month of February with 2278 Primary Members (Plus 7 from January). We had a large increase in Family/Affiliate Members 1497 to 1523 (plus 26) making our total membership 3801. Twenty-seven new members joined in February and 11 prior members re-joined. We had 6 late renews and 185 on-time renewals (57 of these were multi-year renewals). We had one member transfer-in and 6 transferred-out. Twenty-nine members did not renew on time for March 1, 2018.

[April] We ended March with 2276 Primary Members (-2 from February) and 1515 Family/Affiliate Members (-8 from February) making our total membership 3792 (-10). Twenty-six members joined in March and 7 prior Member rejoined. We had 8 late-renewals, and 170 on-time renewals (includes 62 multi-years). We had 2 Members transfer-in and 5 transfer-out (2 to Florida, 1 to Texas, 1 to Northeast and 1 to Peachstate). Thirty-nine Members did not renew on time for April 1st.


[March] By all accounts, the first New Member Gathering of 2018 held at Paul Miller Porsche was a great success and we especially want to thank:

- Bill Gilbert for his coordination for having Paul Miller host the event and provide bagels and door prizes.
- Marlys and Dennis for all her help handing out New Member Certificates and door prize tickets.
- Tom Swift for presenting of the events NNJR has to offer.
- Dom Miliano for taking photos of the event and submitting them later that day to *Porscheforus*.
- Petra for making the event write-up in the March *Porscheforus* the colored centerfold highlighting the new members. We received our copy this afternoon and we think it will go a long way to make the new members who attended feel special.
- All of the Activity Chairs and Devoted Club members who attended and made all of the new members feel welcome.

Through March 1st, an estimated total of 46 new members (Dennis to confirm) joined NNJR/PCA versus our plan of 30 YTD.

29 New Member Certificates valued at \$25 were handed out at the aforementioned gathering. To date, we're aware of one redeemed for Lime Rock. We will continue to assume 100% redemption.

[April] Through April 1st, an estimated total of 72 new members (Dennis to confirm) joined NNJR/PCA versus our plan of 45 YTD. This is a 13% increase over the same period last year and 25% greater than 2016. The green line in the graph below illustrates the current trend versus the past two years:



- Three New Member Certificates were provided at the RSR Concours event for a total distribution of 32 year-to-date. As of this writing, zero certificates have been redeemed.
- Nancy's first "From The Regions" Panorama submission is with the editor and will appear in the May issue. Subsequent submissions are due to the editor by the first of each month for the following print month (e.g., May 1st submission will be printed in June edition). So, please work with Nancy if you want to provide content for future submissions. As a side note regarding photo submissions, Vu Nguyen confirmed that when people join PCA they wave their right for their picture to be be used in publications, so no signed waivers are required.
- Complimentary dealership PCA memberships have been extended at Flemington and Paul Miller, but to date no one is signed up yet.
- The next new member gathering will be part of the May 20th "Welcome To The Club" Concours and Rally event so we are working with Chris, Jeff, and John and have committed to funding breakfast for the event.
