### **III. New Business:**

A. P4US Preview: Rudy Samsel, interim P4US Editor, shared a preview of the magazine's look designed by Iylana Nassiri; the graphics designer we engaged to assist with the magazine production. Efforts are being focused around having the magazine complement the information available on our website. We anticipate including interactive games/contests (with prizes!) and links to our photo galleries. Rudy shared his plan to get the magazine back on track: The May issue is slated for release on May 19<sup>th</sup>, the June issue on June 9<sup>th</sup>, and from July forward, issues will be targeted for the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. Content will be due by the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of the prior month. Magazine production will not be delayed to accommodate late submissions.

By engaging a graphics designer to assist with the mechanics of producing the magazine, the work effort of the P4US Editor has been significantly reduced. Our internal communication / information dissemination processes are being streamlined to improve efficiency and ensure consistent content is pushed to our various communication channels (website, magazine, social media). We are seeking a new P4US Editor for when Rudy steps down in July. The role of the Editor is to work

with the various Committee Chairs to coordinate magazine content and oversee the Graphics Designer's efforts. The BOG is encouraged to share this information with potential candidates.

# Autocross: [Grant Lenahan]

We now have the (finally) reinstated post Covid Car Control Clinic behind us. Overall, thanks to many, many volunteers it was overall a success, with a huge number of thank you notes, and

many reports from "in the car" of appreciative students who learned a ton. I have already seen follow up internet in Autocross (which we could use). The weather was not our friend, but mostly held off, being much better than forecast and providing a GREAT low-friction environment for teaching and learning.m I believe in the end 57 students showed up (yes there were no shows with the weather). Note: this is a very exp[ensive event to put on, at MetLife, and turned a small (counting still underway) loss, but was close to break-even. We knew this going in and are roughly where we expected to be.

Our first true autocross is coming up on Sunday June 4th at Pocono. This event will be challenged due to conflict with a runoff SCCA event - drawing some, but not all, of our SCCA friends away. So far sign up is "ok" - but only because Autocrossers sign up notoriously late. It has always been a last minute decision for many and with stiff competition, we cannot do much to change that. Please pass on the word, and consider joining us.

Thanks to last year's purchase ofd new displays with integrated wireless, we not only have actual working equipment, but much less complexity to troubleshoot each event. The volunteer team did get together earlier this year at my place to test it anyway, end to end. Yes the test was a success.

### Business Manager: [Anthony Wartel]

Porscheforus advertising 2nd quarter invoices were mailed out the week of March 24, 2023 with a due date of April 25, 2023. A total of (17) vendors were billed with a net due of \$18,310 for the 2nd quarter which also included any amount due from previous billings. To date a total of \$7040 has been received with \$11,270 being outstanding.

After numerous phone calls and in person outreach by BoG members, (1) one vendor remains outstanding for both years 2022 and 2023 in spite of a promise to send payment to NNJR.

A total of (3) vendors have not yet sent in their yearly lump sum payments.

A total of (3) vendors are late in sending in their 2nd quarter payments.

(2) potential new vendors were sent Porscheforus, NNJR email and social media rate sheets. A Porsche dealership presently not advertising in Porscheforus is showing some interest in NNJR and being more involved.

Gold Ticket Raffle sales were started with intro at Lightning DE. I sold one book and distributed several books to Janice Ernsting and Steve Corodemus for ongoing sales.

The May 7 Welcome to Club Event was a big success for Charity. Cheshire Home's Kim and Betsey helped with Rally registration and received generous donations from many club members. Several Cheshire Home residents joined us at the car show, and I hope everyone enjoyed talking with them. They loved the cars. The parade over to Cheshire Home to start the rally was accommodated thanks to local police that directed traffic and provided access through a private road. Finally, Charity received \$2990 in donations and rally registrations.

On April 16th we held the Preservation and Restoration Workshop at the Paterek Brothers' Shop in Chatham. After the crowd enjoyed the buffet provided by the Paterek; John, Ray, and Andrew presented an informative program on the proper methods of Porsche paint and body care. Over 75 people listened attentively and were engaged in the discussions. At the conclusion Alan and Hank presented door-prizes, donated by Griot's Garage, to the lucky winners. A thank you letter was sent to the Paterek Brothers.

On Sunday May 7th, we held the Welcome to the Club Concours. We used the NNJR website for registration which provided the entrants' names and their car details ahead of the event. This allowed us to pre-populate the info required on our score sheets to save time on the field. Using the website also avoided the need to handle cash.

By late Saturday, it became apparent that the number of entrants would far exceed the number of available judges, and the judging and scoring would be impossible to complete before the start of the scheduled Rally meeting. The registration was suspended at six o'clock Saturday evening at 50 cars. As it was, even starting the judging 15 minutes early, we ran 15 minutes over into the Rally meeting. It's clear, that if this event is to continue to grow and welcome new members, for next year we need to rethink the timing and logistics of all the activities (Concours, Rally, New Member, and Charity) on the same day.

Kevin Fitzsimmons did an outstanding job leading the Junior Judges in their quest for their choice of Best in Show. Each judge received an official judge's hat and name tag. Kevin also, as part of our Concours marketing strategy and to welcome new-members, conducted filmed interviews with a few new member Concours entrants for posting on our webpage.

At the conclusion of the Concours, all the winners received engraved trophies identifying sponsorship by Porsche of Englewood, and an award of a large bottle of Griot's Garage Car Wash. Thank you letters were sent to all the corporate contributors.

### New Member Enrollments


April saw twenty-two new member enrollments, which is what we planned for. Much to our relief, this was a nice bounce-back from only 15 Newbies signed up the prior month.

- Total enrollments of 78 for the first four months of 2023 are (-2.5%) lower than our YTD plan of 80 new members.
- Year-to-date, new member enrollments are (-10.3%) less than in the same period last year, that decline was primarily driven by the low March numbers:


### NNJR New Member Trend By Year By Month

# **Gallery Photos**

If you want to send pictures for a gallery, please do not send full sized pictures. I can help you figure out how to resize the pictures. For instance, a full size picture can be as large as 15 megabytes, we typically need no more than 600K for a clear picture on the website, or about 5% of the original size. We use an automated process to resize them, but the original file is still saved to the website, which consumes disk space and has a negative impact on overall database performance that serves the pictures to the Gallery

There are free utilities that easily allow you to resize pictures "for the web". If you need help learning about them, send me an email.

### **Online Event and Store**

Concours sign up worked well, but website logs show that some members still struggle at times. I have improved the online documentation on how to use the system.

We added a free upgrade that allows us to customize our events and product pages. For instance, the Concours event had customized input fields with Car classification information.
