While our total numbers are down for the last two years, our total students' numbers are fairly constant to marginally down. Solo drivers' numbers are markedly down. We are also low on the number of instructors this year. I'll have to ask Janice what she did to get 147 drivers in 2019! There must be something going on in Europe, I know of six instructors who are on European vacations over the Lightning 2 weekend. I'll be contacting Metro PCA about possibly teaming up with them next year. This year they have an end of September Fri/Sat at Lightning. It might make sense to combine.

On a positive note, we currently have 185 drivers signed up for VIR, versus 157 from last season. Hopefully this number will hold, or even increase, to finish off the 2023 season.

New Member Enrollments

There's no sugarcoating it: September was a disappointing month, with only fourteen new member enrollments.

- Not only is that eight less than what we planned for, but it is the second lowest September dating back to 2017. This was a disappointing result after what we thought was a bounce back in August enrollments.
- Total enrollments of 173 for the first nine months of 2023 were nearly nine percent lower than our YTD plan of 189 new members.
- Year-to-date, new member enrollments are (-7.5%) less than in the same period last year.
- We are starting to strategize for 2024 on what we can do, if anything, to boost new
 member enrollments next year. Rudy needs to look at the data, but our initial
 hypothesis is that sports car enrollments are down, so we need to look at ways to
 boost four-door enrollments in the coming year to offset it.



APPENDIX: NNJR Annual Awards

I. NNJR Special Awards:

Rookie of the Year

[optional: awarded by consensus of the BOG] - Secretary to obtain award

Criteria: new or newly active member that has demonstrated a high degree of enthusiasm for Club activities through participation and/or volunteering at events across various programs

Enthusiast of the Year

[optional: awarded by consensus of the BOG]- Secretary to obtain award

Criteria: member that has demonstrated outstanding enthusiasm for Club activities through participation and/or volunteering at events across various programs

Marlys and Dennis Thovson Award for Exceptional Service to NNJR

(f/k/a President's Award, originally created by Neil Selest in 2001, changed to the M & D T award in 2018 by current President Tom Swift)

[optional: given at President's discretion]. Secretary to obtain award.

Note: this is considered NNJR's highest honor and the award is given ONLY if truly warranted. It has only been given 11 times since 2001

Criteria: Purpose is to recognize members who work behind the scenes to help NNJR and events run smoothly. Recipient is characterized as one who attends events to assist rather than participate; taking on any task that needs doing with no expectation of recognition.

<u>Charles Fowler Award</u> – established August 7, 1952 by NNJR Founding President Charles Fowler [optional; to be selected by 3 most recent winners: Secretary to obtain keeper trophy and oversee engraving of perpetual trophy]

Criteria: awarded to the member who makes "the greatest contribution of the welfare of the Club"

Bob Moir Most Improved Driver of the Year – established 1995 by Joan Moir

[selected by DE Chair with input from Chiefs] - DE Chair to oversee engraving of perpetual trophy, and obtain keeper trophy for recipient.

Criteria: Presented to driver who has demonstrated the most improvement in driving skills during the past year's DE program.

<u>Charles J. Mulhern Concours d'Elegance Trophy</u> established in 1981

[Annual award / Concours Perpetual trophy] Concours chair to oversee engraving of perpetual trophy and obtain keeper trophy for recipient

Criteria: Typically presented to member with highest season score (based on participation and placement). May also be awarded for special efforts relative to the promulgation of concours history, technique, or restoration guidance (details available from Secretary)

<u>Bill Walsh Award for Excellence in Porsche Related Photography</u> – established 1993 by Irene Walsh. [Annual award; trophy obtained by organizer of Slide Night event]

Criteria: Awarded to member who submits the best Porsche-related picture from Slide night.

Rene Dreyfus Memorial Rally trophy: established circa 1950-60 by a group of NNJR members who frequented the La Chanticler restaurant in NYC, befriended Rene Dreyfus (pre-WWII French Grand Prix driver), and charmed him into donating a silver Champagne cooler as a trophy for the winner of the Rally season. Each year, a group of NNJR'ers would go into NYC to pick up the trophy. The current [now perpetual] trophy is one of the last donated by Dreyfus. Rally Chair to oversee engraving on perpetual trophy and obtain keeper trophies.

Criteria: Highest placing team in the RD Rally – must be NNJR members and must be driving a Porsche.

II. NNJR Program Awards: Given at the discretion of program chairs. Program chairs to obtain trophies for recipients.

Concours: Novice season winner and Rookie season winner

<u>Autocross</u>: Awards by class

Rally: Novice Driver/Navigator team; Experienced Driver/Navigator team

All awards typically given at annual Holiday Party
