We should identify events as 'exclusive' to NNJR or non-exclusive so that they are posted appropriately to our channels. Nicole will distribute a

link to the Google Calendar after the meeting. Chairs should make their updates and email Kristen so that she can run the ChatGPT utility.

Ray Catena Porsche / Porsche Edison

On Jan 22, Ron, Jack Ippolito and I had a very productive meeting with the leadership of Ray Catena Porsche, now known as Porsche Edison. We met in their very large, extraordinarily nice, brand new store.

- Two floors big enough for anything, including an indoor Concours in the future, if we want!
- It's also very important to note that they are about to break ground on Porsche Springfield, which will be an equally impressive (and nearly as large) store that is a new (!!) Porsche store location. At the junction of I78 and the GSP, with direct GSP access.

- They are interested in hosting an F1 watch party. Cindy has given me some dates which I've passed along.
- They would be willing to host a new member get together later in the year.
- They are interested in sponsoring the Lightning 2 DE in October. Based on input from Thom, I've proposed a budget number.
- They are willing to host any/all of the following:
 - Monthly member meeting
 - o DE Tech
 - Concours workshop
 - Etc.

At this point, if you have an event where the host isn't committed for 2025, please consider having them host. Let me know and I will make the introductions. DE tech for Lightning 2 might be nice, if not already committed. A word about parking at their store. Right now it is somewhat limited though they are willing to move cars and make room, as needed. In a year or so, they will be taking over the adjacent AT&T store and later the adjacent strip mall. Both for parking.

It goes without saying that all 3 dealerships are expanding their positive relationship with NNJR. We owe them as much publicity as we can generate as part of our promotion of their events and, of course, a thank you at every relevant public opportunity. In addition, they are all very open to hosting events, in 2025 and beyond.

NNJR 2024 New Member Trend: Plan vs. Actual By Month


